There are few outdoor pieces as mundane as the ubiquitous sun chair. The monotony of design and materials often causes the lounger to fade into the background, unless of course the chair is Summit's 'Sundeck', a stacking adjustable chaise with cushion designed by John Munford. The elegant arched form, coupled with the strong slatted surface, makes this piece as beautiful stacked as it is when in use-not an easy feat.
